The four pillars of the Institute for Sustainable Development.

The Candriam Institute for Sustainable Development commits to giving back to the community via a philanthropic impact program. Its mission is to work towards promoting a sustainable & inclusive society by financially supporting initiatives balanced across four impact areas:

ESG Education & Research

Supporting educational initiatives is a core part of the Institute's ethos.

Candriam is convinced that if finance wants to play a role in the successful transition to a sustainable economic model, then ESG topics should become mainstream in financial education and research.

Social Inclusion & Solidarity

Candriam strongly believes that societies can only thrive sustainably by being inclusive and offering equal opportunities to all. The Institute has a strong focus on offering opportunities for enrichment to children, teenagers and young adults from different backgrounds.

Protect the Environment

The Institute's environmental program invests in initiatives that contribute to climate change mitigation and restore fragile ecosystems while ensuring sustainable livelihoods for local communities.

Fight Against Cancer

Candriam believes that philanthropy has a role to play in supporting innovative and sometimes underfunded cancer research areas.

A thorough impact assessment was conducted together with Candriam healthcare experts in order to select the most impactful cancer research initiatives.

The Institute is involved in over 20 countries.

How the Institute is funded

For 2022, Candriam has set aside 10% of the net management fees earned by Candriam from its oncology strategies and the Sub-funds of the Candriam Sustainable SICAV for the multi-year Institute budget to support sustainability initiatives.

The Institute's governance process

The Board of the Candriam Institute oversees a rigorous selection and validation process of organizations and initiatives to be supported. A Due Diligence process seeks to ascertain the quality of supported initiatives, taking into account the following criteria:

- Creation of positive social impact through educational, research, social and environmental projects
- Local or global initiatives, primarily in Candriam's operating countries
- Alignment with the Institute's objective and values
- Pragmatic and relevant allocation of resources (in financial and organisational terms)
- Reliability and quality of the organisation, including in terms of governance

ESG Education & Research





The Institute's flagship free-for-all education project, Candriam Academy, marked its fifth anniversary in 2022 As of today, it has 13,000 members from all over the world.



In 2022 the partnership with **Kedge Business School** (France) delivered further research into ESG materiality & asset pricing, compiling a white paper on **Climate Concerns & Bond Returns** and also publishing a paper on "The Influence of Sovereign Macroeconomic Policies on the Sustainable Performance of Companies".



The Institute supported again the Imperial College Climate Investment (UK) challenge which offers students the opportunity to address climate change challenges through creative financial solutions and innovations.

The Imperial College Climate Investment Challenge (CIC), an annual competition launched in 2019 that calls for postgraduate university students to develop innovative financial solutions to address climate change--sponsored by Candriam, Quinbrook Infrastructure Partners and Standard Chartered--last year awarded the first prize of £10,000 prize to a team of students from Imperial College Business School.

The winners developed SustainAcre, a project which aims to scale up the use of regenerative agriculture practices, while also making sustainable farmland an attractive proposition for retail investors.



The Institute continued supporting the "Measurement in Economics, Nowcasting – Beyond GDP" chair of **Paris School of Economics** (France).



Over the last years Candriam significantly contributed to the development of an articulated range of high educational content at the **University of LUMSA** (Italy). This contribution enabled the pioneering Master of Science in Management of Sustainable Development Goals (MSDG) and, subsequently, the Executive Masters in Sustainable Finance and Sustainable Management dedicated to managers.



Since September 2019, Candriam has been the official partner of the Chair in Regenerative and Circular Economy at **UCLouvain** (Belgium) to strengthen the investment industry's efforts towards a sustainable and inclusive climate recovery by fostering academic efforts towards a circular economy.



Protecting the Environment

Candriam continued to support Close the Gap, an international social enterprise which provides high-quality refurbished IT devices for social and educational projects - thus combining the environmental virtues of a circular economy approach with social impact. Selected projects in 2022 included an IT hub in Kenya, the "Digital for Youth" initiative in Belgium and the MIT React project for refugees.



Thanks to the Institute's support and a subsequent employee engagement campaign, in 2022, Candriam supported **WeForest**'s project in Senegal which is restoring the Casamance mangroves, planting 523 hectares and over two million trees, the equivalent of nearly 600 football pitches. The tree planting has been done by local people under the supervision of WeForest. Local communities are fully engaged in the process from initiation to planting and monitoring.

In 2022, Candriam started a new partnership with **AIRC** Foundation for Cancer Research in Italy. The Institute now supports 12 leading organizations in Europe & Worldwide that are advancing innovative, cancer research projects, as well as providing social support and patient care.



An international not-for-profit organisation—**Breast International Group**—representing the largest global network of academic research groups dedicated to finding better treatments and cures for breast cancer. Over 100,000 patients have participated in BIG trials. Candriam's support is helping to fund the Aurora project, which aims to decode the genetic changes that drive the evolution of metastatic breast cancer.



Leading the fight against cancer in Spain with the non-profit Asociación Española Contra el Cáncer, which focuses on four main areas: Prevention; Awareness; Patient care; and Research. The Association, which has 52 offices across the country, supports a number of Spanishbased and international research projects, working with organizations such as Cancer UK. The association provides a large range of help to cancer sufferers, from help with accommodation to income support.

Social Inclusion & Solidarity

A particular focus on empowering youth from underprivileged backgrounds.



The Candriam Helping Those Who Help program supports charitable social impact projects led or presented by Candriam employees. All projects must be in line with the objectives and values of The Candriam Institute and must be related to sustainable development and social inclusion (such as youth empowerment, solidarity, poverty, distress, health).

In 2022, Helping Those Who Help selected 11 local associations, supporting projects ranging alleviating childhood poverty to water access.

Since 2001, Helping Those Who Help, has donated over 1.9 million euros to 101 associations, supporting more than 195 projects.



Maastricht University

In 2022 the Institute further strengthened its inclusive youth empowerment program with new scholarships awarded to first-generation students at Maastricht University in the Netherlands and a renewed partnership with Article-1 to whose youth mentoring program Candriam staff also contributes in France.



In 2022, Candriam also showed its solidarity in times of crisis, supporting initiatives to help children affected by the devastating floods in Pakistan as well as families and students uprooted by the war in Ukraine with Sciences Po.



The Démos (Dispositif d'éducation musicale et orchestrale à vocation sociale - Musical and orchestral education plan with social purpose) project is a musical and orchestral education outreach program aimed at young people from economically deprived or rural areas throughout France. Over a 10-year period, over 10,000 children have been supported by the project.



In Belgium, the **Boost project** aims to empower talented young people from underprivileged backgrounds and give them equal opportunities to succeed. Since its launch in 2011, over 750 young people have already been part of the program.
